The School has particular interest in individuals with at least some international development experience, either as a scholar with a few years of post-graduate academic experience, or experience in the field, such as with U.S. government, multilateral or non-profit development institutions. Preference will be given to candidates willing and able to teach our core micro-economics course and to advise our growing number of Ph.D. students in international development. We welcome applications from women and minorities.
